## The Resin Identification Codes

- Remember to rinse all food and beverage containers. Caps may be placed back on bottles
- Place dry plastic containers with only ID #s 1,2,3,5 and 7 (loose) into your recycling cart for curbside collections.

**NOTE: Numbers 4 and 6 are NOT accepted for recycling and must be placed in trash.**

- # 4- Plastic bags are NOT accepted nor yard trim. Clean and dry plastic bags, wraps, and film are accepted at most grocery stores and various retailers throughout the County. [PlasticFilmRecycling.org](http://PlasticFilmRecycling.org)
- #6 – Foam food products and foam packaging, including peanuts and Styrofoams, are NOT accepted. Check with your local UPS and FedEx mailing facilities
